Objectives :

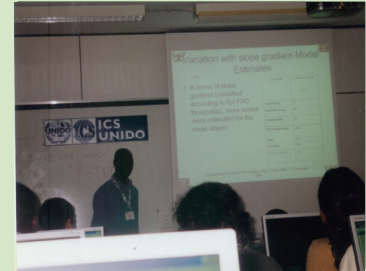
